#### ROMANIA - PATH OF LIFE / ACV:

In September we had a prayer meeting in Racatau (Cluj – Napoca area) with 45 volunteers who work on prison, to pray together, but also to encourage each other and find solutions for different challenges.

Top Right: ACV mentors outside Oradea Prison. We started a new Mentoring Program in Oradea Prison with 19 inmates. We meet each week with our Apprentices, and all sessions were very good. In December we finished with some good feedback. 14 inmates finish all 12 sessions and

we prepare for them diplomas and some books, as a gift. We sang and shared testimonies. We was blessed this year with strong help from Emanuel University students who came along every session on our Mentoring Program.



After the summer break, we started Guitar Class again on our office and we finish on 21 December with a great Christmas Celebration. We gave gifts for all kids, and share food at the end. Each week we practice guitar, but also we had a Bible lesson. Sometimes we play a game. 3 students from Emanuel University

We had also another 2 ladies: Lavinia and Damaris who lead and plan all meetings. We had a blessing also to use two guitar teachers, because we had about 9 new kids who need special help on guitar. So each week we split to work with beginners and advanced.

In October Andy Paine came to visit. Over four days, Andy, with Sorin interpreting, taught our 'On The Edge' course, about working with the marginalised, to students at Emanuel University. We had 31 students who attended. Each afternoon we give students some practical experience: Monday we visit

the Prison, Tuesday we visit Night Shelter where we share food with outside people who live there, and Wednesday we visit a home where 26 kids Prison. live. In all the places we sang songs, shared testimonies and teaching from Bible. We also visited a lot of churches where Andy preached and ACV workers have different testimonies about our mission.

Usually we visit Night Shelter once a month, but in November we have help from a church in a village outside Oradea. They prepare food for homeless 6 times on last 6 weeks of this year. This church, by this lady, Voichita, prepare food, but ACV team prepare and lead worship program with songs and also with Bible message each week. We put the seeds and we pray that God come with fruits.

From October we start a new mission in Telechiu with a house (Care system) for 26 children. We visited 5 times with a team of students and in December we visited with a special team from ACV to sing carols and give gifts to each child. There was big joy on kids' faces, a big thanks from the house parent who was very happy to welcome us each time. One Sunday I invited the kids, about 14, to visit one Baptist church where



kids can sing and be part of a special Carol Night. It was first time when kids were in an evangelical church. We pray that God continue to work on this special kids.

In December we prepare gifts for inmates when we go in to sing and preach about Jesus on Christmas time. We visit with 13 Helpful abbreviations: DT = Damascus Trust; PTSM = I Support a Pastor/Parish; ADOB = Anglican Diocese of E Of Gasabo; WMP = Water Harvesting Project; ACV = An Association); TMB = Tarmworth Men's Breakfast; EWTB=

students who prepare a lot of carols for inmates who don't have a family or support from nobody. We had also two guests from Budapest – Hungary, who come first time to share about God in Romanian Prison. One was in prison for 30 years, another one for 20 years. So both come to share testimony about how they find God in that difficult time.

On 2 days we visited also around 95 children from family where one of their parents is in prison. 3 cars travelled each day on different area to finish until Christmas time. But it was a big blessing to visit with songs, prayers, yoghurt juice, kids books, clothes for very poor family.

For all that we done we are very thankful to God first, but also to all of our volunteers who helped us to run all of these activities. Also we are thankful to all our partners who support us financially and in prayer. Praise to the Lord that we are free to spread the Gospel all over. So please pray with us that we will share God's work and be fruitful!  $\Omega$ 

#### RWANDA - DIOCESES OF BYUMBA AND GASABO

Three others travelled with Andy - Peter and Susanna Harrington and Marelize Wright who are from a SAP Partner Church in Halstead, Crossways Christian Fellowship.

We began our visit in Byumba diocese with a focus on the DT

Water Harvesting Projects, as this was the first time we were able to visit

WHP parishes since the scheme was set up in 2019. Whilst Peter and Andy spent time with the WHPs, Susanna and Marelize worked with adults doing some Movement in Worship workshops

and parachute games with children. It was wonderful to see the impact these activities had, especially the Movement in Worship. Templates for making flags

The WHPs are going well and we were 🔀 able to clarify the details needed for record keeping and for the use of the different funds benefitting from the income generated. We then travelled down to Gasabo diocese where we were able to visit five of the parishes included in the SAP programme. There has been a lot of development within the diocese over the last three years, especially in construction of new church buildings. This is partly due to government legislation to improve church facilities, but also to the vision of Archbishop Mbanda. The impact has been huge and congregations are growing, numerically and spiritually as a result.



In our discussion with Abp



Mbanda, we were asked if we could run the DT WHP Scheme in another three dioceses (Nyaruguru,

Gasabo, and Karongi), so please pray for this as we set them up. We are also making some progress for adding filtration systems into existing WHPs. Please pray for us to make progress in this as well.  $\Omega$
