Loan Fund for pastors and parishes: We have drawn up a proposed plan with our partners in Byumba diocese, for setting up a Loan Fund that will run in a similar way to one in the diocese of Gasabo. Some or all of DT's monthly SAP money will be put into this fund. Pastors and parishes can then borrow from this fund to help them set up income-generating projects or help with church building repairs or community work. Each loan is repaid within a year at a very low interest rate (1%) and this enables the fund to continue to serve the needs of individuals and congregations.

This scheme is working well in Gasabo and we hope it will run as well in Byumba. Rather than maintaining a dependency on outside help, this scheme becomes self-supporting over time and enables pastors to provide for themselves and their families, now and in retirement. Several parishes have already set up income-generating projects that help people come together to encourage one another and to share in Bible reading and prayer whilst also working together in the different projects.

The Loan Fund will have its own account, separate from the other diocesan accounts and be overseen by a group of senior diocesan staff. Pastors and parishes applying for a loan will have to present a basic business plan for what they will use the money for, how it will generate income and how they will pay the loan back. Initially loan amounts will be limited so as to help as many people as possible within the first year.

DT is planning to 'prime the pump' of this project with a one-off donation. Ω

The closure of church buildings remains a huge challenge for the Church of Jesus in Rwanda. The lack of church services, resulting in a lack of income, means that the poorer dioceses, such as Byumba, are really struggling financially. Whatever they try to do and whichever way they turn, they are hampered by a lack of money. This is putting a severe pressure on the diocesan staff and especially the senior leaders.

Yet despite this pressure, the Church continues to grow! People are coming to Christ and being baptised. Home groups are active and witnessing within their local communities. Income-generating projects are used to bring church members together for prayer and Bible reading - as well as working on the projects.

With closed buildings, the real Church is standing firm and developing stronger relationships with one another as well as with the Lord Jesus, through small group activity. Here are some recent comments from different pastors:

“God is at work, there is a spiritual growth among Christians and we praise God for that.”

“The church is not a building, rather it is people. And the work of the Lord never stops whatever situation, He makes new ways of keeping the church in service.”

“We have come to understand what the real church of God is. We organise home fellowship and do Bible study, pray for various requests, and help one another according to needs. We have also initiated saving and credit program brings people together in small groups, and it becomes much easier for pastor to minister to them.”

“God manifested himself in the closing of church building to remind us what the real church of God is. Our ministry is now people oriented in their community. We do outreach evangelism and people do respond. We have come to realise that home is the centre of church ministry, and we take it as God’s revelation.”

“Even though the church building is closed, we are seeing God working in different ways like the sick / ill people are getting healed, the poor ones are getting answers to their issues, God’s peoples are fulfilling their responsibilities in the church.”

We praise Almighty God that nothing can stop Christ from building his Church.

Where buildings are open, the Church is also growing. One parish has had to add two more Sunday services to cope with the numbers of people attending. Other parishes report increased attendance across all age groups. Ω

However, most church buildings in Byumba Diocese remain closed. Many have complied with the government requirements, but are waiting to be inspected and authorised to open once again. Whilst waiting, home groups continue to be the main opportunity for meeting and fellowship, but not all church members attend these meetings. One church building in Rukizi parish was allowed to re-open because it is near the Ugandan border and church members were crossing into Uganda to attend church services. So this parish was allowed to re-open its building to avoid this.

Since church buildings were closed and church services stopped, the income for all dioceses has dropped severely. This continues to impact diocesan staff as well as diocesan projects. The new cathedral building in Byumba was started before the closure of church buildings, but now it has stopped. This needs to restart soon before the Construction Permit expires otherwise they have to re-apply. Bp Emanuel and his senior clergy need wisdom to know what to do - so we need to pray for them. Ω

Christmas is a serious time of celebration and witness for the Church in Rwanda. Lights, decorations, carols and new clothes for church services are all part of their traditions. As in the UK, many people, who do not normally attend church services, do attend over Christmas. There is lots of joy, expressed through singing and dancing and there are many evangelistic opportunities. Ω

A number of ex-pastors in Byumba diocese, who did not qualify for further theological training, are needing vocational training instead. This will help them find employment, but funding for this is very low. DT is doing what we can to help with our limited resources, Please pray that other funding will be found. Ω

Evangelist Boniface Rukotana (Giti sub-parish ADoB) died suddenly on January 7th. He was running church services on the Sunday, felt unwell on the Monday and died early on Tuesday morning. The cause of death has not yet been determined so please pray for all concerned. Ω

- Pray for Boniface's wife Claudine and children Fiston, Alice, Samuel, Denyse, Aline. Pray that they will know God's peace and provision at this time of grief.
- Pray also for the Church in Giti in their loss of a pastor.
- Let's pray for God's protection, physical, mental and spiritual, on all pastors and their families at this time. They are having to deal with many challenges.
- Please pray that, despite the wait for buildings to be opened again, the Christians will stay strong and committed to Christ and to one another.
- Please pray that right decisions will be taken over the construction of the new cathedral in Byumba diocese. Whilst it is needed, it is a huge financial commitment when many pastors are living hand-to-mouth.
- In Bwambi parish (ADoB) they are grateful to God for the birth of a calf! Not only is there milk for the calf, but also for the parish to sell in the community. We thank the Lord for this practical blessing. Each parish has at least one cow provided by DT funds.
- Give thanks for the Vocational Training that is available in Giti parish (ADoB). This gives young people especially a good start for getting employment.
- In Kibare parish (ADoB) they are praying for local infrastructure to improve. This includes electricity, clean water, a good road and health support. Things we take for granted, they have to live without. Please pray for things to improve.
- Praise God for the goats that Kinihira parish (ADoB) has bought using DT SAP money. Animal husbandry is an income-generating project for many parishes.
- Please pray for young people in parishes where buildings are closed. They can still meet for weekly activities (choir practice, church building maintenance) which they use to read the Bible, encourage one another and pray together.
- Give thanks for the demonstration of God's power in people's lives even outside of church services! Many people are experiencing God's healing of physical and mental illness.
- Please continue to pray for Bishops Emmanuel and Laurent as well as the senior staff as they carry the burden of responsibility for the pastors and congregations. Pray that they will have Holy Spirit wisdom in decision-making.

It has been a busy time for the ACV team over the last three months. In Oradea prison they have been running three programmes for inmates.

'One Day with Father' is about learning to be a good dad based on Biblical teaching. It included practical advice and finished with a session in a sports arena for the inmates, wives/partners and children, with games, activities and refreshments.

'Prisoners' Journey' is a programme to help inmates prepare for work outside and helps them regain their self-worth and even aspire to achieve in a career. Again it has Christian principles. All who complete the course get a diploma certificate.

'ACV Mentoring programme' is for 12 weeks. It addresses aspects of life that prisoners struggle with (anger, guilt, forgiveness, money, relationships, work etc) using Biblical teaching and discussion groups. 18 inmates completed the course and received a diploma. Some of these have made a commitment to Christ and have been baptised, but will need help and support to make their commitment stick. Each month ACV is responsible for leading a Sunday service in Oradea Prison and, since changing to an afternoon time, more prisoners now attend. Ω

The weekly **guitar classes** continue in term time. Two groups (beginners and advanced) are run with both groups joining together for the Bible teaching and activities as part of each session. For a Christmas treat, all the children and teachers went down-town together for a ride on the Big Wheel and for some food. Ω

ACV work with Angel Network to put together and distribute Christmas Shoeboxes to families who have a parent in prison. This year they gave boxes to 103 children living throughout Bihor county. Ω

ACV continues to provide food parcels for some of the poorest families in Oradea and to visit the **Night Shelter** at least once a month. Students from Emanuel University are regularly involved in this ministry and hot food is provided by a local restaurant owner who is a Christian. Ω

- Give thanks to the Lord for the three programmes that have been run in Oradea Prison over the last three months. Praise God for the open door that we have into the prison!
- Please pray for those prisoners who have made a commitment to Christ. Pray that the ACV team will be able to nurture them, especially during the Sunday services.
- Pray too for the prison staff, especially for Laura who helps and supports ACV with their visits and for the Director, Cyprien.
- We give thanks for those who provide food, hot and cold, to be used in the ministry of ACV. Give thanks for Daniel, the owner and cook of the ‘House of Compassion’ restaurant who provides hot meals for the Night Shelter visits.
- Pray for all those families who were gifted Christmas Shoeboxes. Pray that these acts of kindness accompanied by songs and encouragements from the Bible will touch their hearts and bring them to Christ.
- Monthly prayer meetings have been established within the life of ACV, led by Nicu Maior. These have become a foundation on which ACV does its work. Thank the Lord for the impact prayer has on their ministry.
- We also give thanks for the partner churches that support ACV through prayer and financial giving. Many of ACV volunteers come from these partner churches. It was good for Andy and Howard to visit some of these churches in October.
- Pray for each ACV Manager and the area of responsibility they have. Emil (prison services) Nicu (prayer) Iosif (food distribution) Sorin (prison courses, guitar class) Florin (Night Shelter) Oliver (logistics) Noemi (students).
- Please pray for the guitar classes as they start up again after Christmas. Pray for the young people who come each week, that they will want to follow the Jesus they sing and learn about.
- Pray for protection, spiritual and physical, on all who work with ACV as volunteers. As they work with those on the margins of society, pray that the Holy Spirit will empower and enable them for the work amongst young and old alike.
- We thank the Lord for the financial support that is being given for the ministry, by individuals as well as by partner churches. Pray that the money will be used well.
